Abstract *	The Plio-Pleistocene site of Dmanisi, Georgia, has yielded an impressive sample of hominin cranial and postcranial remains, which document the presence of Homo outside Africa around 1.8 million years ago. Here we report on a new cranium from Dmanisi (D4500) that, together with mandible D2600 found earlier, represents the first completely preserved adult hominin skull from the early Pleistocene. D4500/D2600 combines a small braincase (545 cc) with a large prognathic face, and exhibits close morphological affinities with the earliest known Homo fossil, maxilla A.L. 666-1 from Hadar, Ethiopia. The Dmanisi sample, which now comprises five crania, provides direct evidence for wide morphological variation within early Homo paleodemes, even outside Africa. This implies the existence of a single evolving lineage of early African Homo with phylogeographic continuity across continents. Dmanisi likely represents a paleodeme of H. habilis who dispersed out of Africa before the emergence of H. erectus.
